



LP Delta Trap - ASSEMBLY & USE

Item List: Large Plastic Trap • 2 Inserts (CAUTION: STICKY) • Wire Hanger









Fold the end of one side of the bottom of trap upwards, following the crease.


Place the tabs on each side of the turned-up portion of the bottom into the two tab openings located on each side of the trap body.



perforated tab slot openings

Slide the insert, sticky side up, into the trap body from the side of the trap where the bottom has not been turned up.

After the insert is in place, fold up the remaining bottom end and place the tabs into the remaining tab slot openings.



Remove one lure from foil pouch. Attach lure as follows:

Rubber Septa Lure:

Place lure on wire hanger inside trap.

Fiber Lure:

Remove backing from lure and adhere to inside side panel of trap. Take care to insure open ends of fibers do not become blocked with glue on trap.

All Other Lures:

Place on sticky surface of trap bottom, taking care not to coat the surface of the lure with the glue from the trap.

NOTE: To prolong storage life, refrigerate or freeze unused lures in their sealed pouch.

Use of tweezers or rubber gloves is recommended for handling septa lures to avoid contaminating septa.

To avoid cross-contamination, only handle traps and lures for one specific insect species at a time. Wash hands and working surfaces thoroughly before assembling and baiting traps for other species.

Hang trap by wire hanger.

Replace inserts when dirty or covered with insects.
